We enter the season of Lent as the Church Liturgical Cycle unfolds. During this time of approximately forty days and nights we take stock of our lives and express sorrow for our sins. Striving to be more Christ-like in our daily lives allows the Lord to enter our hearts and souls and live within us. Omitting the Recessional Hymn gives us time to reflect in quiet meditation during the instrumental or choral Postlude.

The texts of the Choir Anthem (11:30) and the Communion Meditation, sung by Paul condon (9:00 & 11:30) are ideal personal meditations for the Lenten season. They are respectfully: "O Love that casts out fear, O Love that casts out sin, tarry no more without, but come and dwell within. True sunlight of the
