Jesus is quite clear in calling Himself the Good Shepherd, unlike the hired shepherd who runs away when danger approaches his flock. Jesus is willing to lay down His life for His sheep. He knows His sheep and His sheep know Him. Interestingly, Jesus also speaks of tending and leading sheep that do not belong to the fold. This is obviously a reference to non-Jews (the Gentiles) and also sinners, which of course we all are, as well as the outcasts of society.

So, this weekend, which is called "Good Shepherd Sunday", we sing of the love and caring which the Lord gives to anyone who searches for, and is willing to know Him. Easter joy continues in the Recessional Hymn. The Offertory Hymn tells us to go to Jesus for rest and comfort in our turbulent world. The Adult Choir Anthem (11:30) is a simple yet beautiful setting by Virgil Thomson of the beloved Psalm 23. Jesus is the just God of the Trinity, powerful and ruling, but also nurturing to his people like a caring mother.
