Sustaining Earth-: Wed September 16th: 6 PM

The inaugural event of <u>Sustaining Earth</u> will be held at Panasci Family Chapel at LeMoyne College. It will bring together 3 speakers to consider the recently released papal encyclical on the environment and climate change - Dr. Christina Peppard (Fordham University), Dr. Lawrence Tanner (Le Moyne College), and Dr. James Schaeffer (Marquette University). They will address: (1) the contents of the encyclical itself and their place within the broader context of Catholic thought and Francis' papacy; (2) the science of climate change; and (3) our ethical implication in climate change and the action toward which Pope Francis is calling all of us.

Sponsored by the McDevitt Center, <u>Sustaining Earth</u> is motivated by a sense of the urgency of growing threats to our environment. Through the public events in this initiative....we seek to ground and frame the issues within the context of our broadly religious perspectives on our human relation to the environment and our ethical obligations to care for the environment - all with the intention of helping to foster informed and concerted action to sustain Earth.
