We learn in today's Gospel more about Jesus' miracles indicating His true power over nature, specifically in restoring sight to the blind man, Bartimaeus. Many miracles are related in the pages of Scripture and they do tell us of the Lord's compassion. More important, however, is the miracle of love and serenity which we receive from Almighty God, that constant spirit of love which at times is difficult to understand and grasp during times in our lives, those times when we seem not to receive what we ask of God. Our hymns sing of the power and might of God, as well as the need to always have faith in the Lord even at dark times. We need not to see, as the blind man did, to have this faith and express it in our lives. The Choir Anthem (11:30) is a setting of the beautiful Psalm 23, which characterizes the Lord as the gentle and nurturing shepherd, the Good Shepherd who know His sheep as His sheep know Him. Each verse of the music is slower and dynamically bigger, emphasizing the ever growing truth of the Lord's caring and protection of us, which culminates with His sheep, the Faithful, finally dwelling with God forever on the Heaven which He has prepared for us! Thank you to all who donated women's socks and hygiene supplies for the Women's Emergency Shelter. A group of parishioners, including members of our Young Adult Group, gathered at noon on Saturday to prepare a ziti casserole with a tossed salad. We prepared gift bags for the women at the shelter with the new socks and the supplies you provided. The gift bags and meal to were brought to the shelter at 2pm. We met the shelter staff and toured the facility. Women who find themselves on the street with nowhere to else to go must register for public assistance. A request for housing is then initiated, and they are referred to the shelter until a housing arrangement is located. Sometimes the women have children with them- recently several women with children were living at the shelter.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors:

The organizer of the Men's Shelter Breakfast Runs, Mary Jo Galletta, submitted a request to Faith in Action a few weeks ago. We were asked to provide Sunday morning breakfast at the men's shelter October 25th. NHN sent out a request to the email list for a volunteers, as well as for donations of coffee, fruit and breakfast breads. Donations were collected and volunteers arrived this morning at 6:30am to distribute the food to the men as they left the shelter for the streets of Syracuse.
