



From Our Pastor

Dear Friends,

Thanksgiving Day is a wonderful reminder that being together is often more joyous than exchanging gifts. Our presence is the gift \sim a gift so longed for by more and more people as we continue to find ourselves torn apart by a pace of life that is inhuman and spirit breaking.

A beautiful example of seeing our blessings and not our problems comes to us from Robinson Crusoe - he was ship-wrecked on a lonely island and he made two columns on paper - one "blessings" the other "problems". He then wrote in each: I am shipwrecked ~ but sill alive. Separated from humanity ~ but not starving. He had no clothes ~ but was in a hot climate. He was without means of defense ~ but there were no wild beasts. He had no one to talk to ~ but God was there.

He thus concluded that there was not any condition in the world so miserable, but there was something to be thankful for. Try listing your challenges and blessings the same way and give thanks to God.

May you and yours have a Blessed Thanksgiving Season.

Hospital Admittance

If you or a member of your family is admitted to a hospital, please be sure to contact the Parish Office. The local hospitals do NOT contact us and we have no idea who is hospitalized unless the family informs us. In case of **emergency**, there is a Catholic priest chaplain on duty at all times at every hospital; the chaplain is available to administer the Sacrament of the Sick. If you are going in for a scheduled surgery, one of the priests here at Holy Cross would be happy to administer the Anointing of the Sick during the week or after Mass on Sunday. Also, each of the hospitals has Eucharistic Minsters who make daily rounds to distribute Holy Communion; notify the nurse's Station or Chaplain's Office to be on the list.
