Catholics age 18 to 59 are bound to the law of fasting. ("The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing-as far as quantity & quality are concerned-approved local custom." If you missed the February Peace & Justice meeting:

Sr. Colette Walter is Household Coordinator for Francis House, a home for terminally ill patients who have have no family, or patients for whom spending their last days with family is not an option. Sister shared that the goal of Francis House is to provide a comforting home environment for the dying patients in their care. The sounds and smells of a home are a source of comfort for dying patients. The Sisters of St. Francis provide professional nursing in collaboration with Hospice. Volunteers are necessary to provide ordinary household duties like cooking and cleaning and hospitality for visiting family members. To volunteer, a 5 session training program is provided. It includes information about the how the house is run, communicating with patients, and the stages of dying. A new training session begins Tuesdays in April. Volunteers could be an individual or a couple and are asked to commit to a 4 hour shift twice a month. A current need is for someone to staff the reception desk and answer phone calls.
