Kevin will tell us about the exciting outreach work at St Lucy's Church, Jail Ministry and Pedals to Possibilities. Jail Ministry serves primarily to advocate for people incarcerated in the Onondaga County Justice Center. In addition to the Visitor-Advocacy Program, this ministry performs social-justice work, helps facilitate Recovery, offers a Poverty Bail Program and holds prayer meetings and Bible study with the inmates. Today over 60 volunteers share their light and gifts on a regular basis to ensure that the Gospel imperative to visit the prisoner is lived out faithfully in our community. Parishioner Keith Cieplicki set some goals in his role as coordinator of Jail Ministry: when the Catholic Sun asked what he enjoys about his vocation, Cieplicki responded, "I love the fact that my job is to love people."

Pedals to Possibilities: this innovative program encourages program participants to take control of their own fitness and well being by committing to regular bike excursions. Participants from the neighborhood join Brady staff and volunteers for bike rides three times per week. Bikes are provided at no cost to participants, and after 10 rides, each participant receives a free bike, helmet, and lock. Rides are on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays 9:00 am – 10:30 am.
