



3 Day Service Retreat for Adults: August 25-27, 9am to 4 pm

On the retreat, three issues we will address are: incarceration, poverty, and homelessness. The ways we touch each of these issues is through lessons, reflections, tours, and action. We will visit the justice center, with a follow up at jail ministry to hear the story and work the phones. At Brady Faith Center we will spend a morning sharing coffee and stories with some homeless men and some people who work with them on a regular basis. We are setting up some home sites to help people around their home in exchange for their story. We believe that the story is as important as the doing! Brady will be our home base. We will ask participants to meet there at 9am. The schedule will be different every day, but will include service, story, and learning.

Butternut Community Center Meeting

Syracuse Police Officer Kenn Burdick met with Holy Cross volunteers last week. He said that the Center will be changing its location, sponsorship and focus. The Butternut Center will begin a partnership with Syracuse Parks & Recreation and it will be located in the Schiller Park recreation building. The new Center will serve Northside youths from ages 7 to 18. Pots of soup will no longer be necessary - meals will be provided by the City. Officer Burdick stressed the need for an effective tutoring and mentoring program. John Gamage will meet with Officer Burdick in late September to assess the needs of the program and how Holy Cross volunteers can assist in the future.

If you would like to continue providing a pot of soup or a hot meal on a regular basis, check with Beth about our parish monthly commitment to Dorothy Day Women's Shelter.
