Since Independence Day was Friday, we sing and pray that God will ever bless and protect our country., keeping it strong yet compassionate to all the peoples of the world.

As we contemplate the wonders of the Lord and our invitation to being a member of the body of Christ, we enter the extended period of liturgical time called"Ordinary Time". In no way is the Liturgy nor are the Scripture Readings ordinary! This is not the meaning of the word, and perhaps it can be confusing to some. The word "Ordinary" refers to the the way we say numbers. "Cardinal" numbers are such as "one, two, three, four", while "Ordinal" numbers are such as ":first, second, third, fourth." Thus, Ordinary Time refers to that time during the Liturgical Cycle when the Church counts the Sundays from the Easter / Pentecost season to the end of the Church Year, just before Advent begins. The last Sunday in Ordinary Time is the Feast of Christ the King. So we fully immerse ourselves in the life of Christ during His three-year public ministry. Let us enjoy the season and SING WITH FULL VOICE the Hymns, Mass Parts, and Responses! Make the most of "Ordinary Time"!
