# Adopt a Refugee Family update: We have a Family!

We have learned a few details about our adopted refugee family. They are from Somalia, and the family is a single mother with nine children. The oldest is a disabled young woman in a wheelchair. The youngest is 18 months old. They arrived at midnight, April 30th. They have been assigned to temporary housing until a handicapped accessible apartment on the north side can be located. If you know of suitable apartment, please contact Beth (contact info above).

Our household items collection and our used furniture round up activities have been completed. Thank you to all who are contributed to the parish effort to furnish an apartment. Thank you to the dedicated parishioners who loaded, counted and stored the new and used treasures donated by Holy Cross parishioners. Thank you for actively and/or prayerfully supporting this Parish project.

We send a special note of thanks for the creative thinking of young Maia Marshall, who donated part of her Lego collection so that the children arriving will have toys with which to play.

Next steps: the Adopt a Refugee Family Committee will meet with the Catholic Charities Refugee Resettlement Caseworker to learn about more about the family and the ways that we can help them acclimate to their new environment. We will have the chance to get to know them in the next few weeks. When an apartment is located, we will begin cleaning and preparing it. We hope to move the furniture on Saturday, May 31st.
