The Solemnity of The Epiphany of The Lord is sometimes referred to as "Little Christmas", the day on which the Church celebrates the manifestation of Christ to the whole world, the Jewish people and the Gentiles (non-Jews) alike. In some countries, gifts are exchanged on this day, replicating the gifts which were given to the Christ Child by the Kings from the Orient. The Three Kings (The Magi) represent the outsiders who are not of the Jewish faith. On the day of the Epiphany there is also a custom of chalking the doorway above church doors and homes. It is an ancient custom that "marks the church and households for Christ". Above the entryway in chalk (a reminder that we are made from dust) can be written the following inscription: 20+C+M+B+18

The year, 2018, is split and placed at the beginning and the end of the marking. The three "+" are the Sign of the Cross, and the initials "CMB" stand for the traditional names of the wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Interestingly, the letters also stand for the Latin phrase: "Christus mansionem benedicat" ("May Christ bless this house"). This day is indeed fraught with imagery and unusual practices. We may ponder them as we sing the hymns of the Epiphany.

Men's Book Group:


