The day after the Epiphany until the day before Ash Wednesday inclusive, is called Carnival, which, according to the Oxford and Merriam-Webster dictionaries, refers to the period observed in the Roman Catholic Calendar as a "farewell to the flesh or meat", indulgences in rich food, meat and sweets, accompanied by festivals, parades and parties. All Roman Catholic countries, as well as some in the Orthodox traditions observe some form of Carnival. The season reaches its zenith on the day before Ash Wednesday, called Fat Tuesday, Shrove Tuesday, or in French, Mardi Gras. We are well familiar with this festival in New Orleans, Louisiana. Precisely at Midnight, all of the revelry comes to an abrupt end, as Ash Wednesday begins the penitential season of Lent.

The Communion Meditation is from Psalm 54: "How lovely rre Thy dwellings, O Lord of Hosts! My soul longeth for the courts of the Lord. The sparrow hath found her a house where she may lay her young, even Thine altars O Lord, my King and my God. O Lord, hear my prayer." This is the week of Prayer for Christian Unity. 

If you or a member of your family is admitted to a hospital, please be sure to contact the Parish Office. The local hospitals do NOT contact us and we have no idea who is hospitalized unless the family informs us. In case of **emergency**, there is a Catholic priest chaplain on duty at all times at every hospital; the chaplain is available to administer the Sacrament of the Sick. If you are going in for a scheduled surgery, one of the priests here at Holy Cross would be happy to administer the Anointing of the Sick during the week or after Mass on Sunday. Also, each of the hospitals have Eucharistic Minsters who make daily rounds to distribute Holy Communion; notify the nurse's Station or Chaplain's Office to be on the list.
