The readings continue to relate the events during which Jesus used His healing powers. Our hymns sing in praise of the Almighty Triune God, and indeed, in the Recessional Hymn we sing that God deserves our adoration which goes simply beyond all efforts of praise on our part. We read of the curing of the leper. The disease of leprosy was so feared by the people of this time, that they were afraid to be in close proximity of a victim, let alone touch one of them. Yet Jesus did just that, and cured him. Today, a treatment using certain antibiotics can kill the bacillus that causes leprosy. Jesus' power obviously enabled just this to cure the leper. Or was it simply His word that did this? A thought to ponder!

Today is the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday which begins the penitential season of Lent. When we sing the Gospel "Alleluia", it is the last Sunday we sing it until the Easter Vigil. Today, sing it loudly and with great fervor. The Choir Anthem (11:30) sings, "**Make a joyful noise unto the Lord all ye lands, Serve the Lord with gladness, Come before His Presence with singing. It is He that made us and not we ourselves. For the Lord, He is God! We are His people, the sheep of his pasture. The Lord is good and His love is everlasting. Amen.**" Ernest Camerota
