Although we engage in sacrificial acts of self-denial during Lent, we have now come to a day of joy and anticipation on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, known as "Laetare" or "Rejoice" Sunday. On this day the Resurrection of the Lord on Easter Sunday is anticipated. Each Mass has a name which is taken from the first word or words of the Entrance Antiphon or Introit. If you look on Page 83 of the Missal portion of the Hymnal you can see the Entrance Antiphon, which says, "*Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast*". The Latin reads, "*Laetare, Jerusalem, et conventum facite, omnes qui diligitis eam...*". So at this midpoint in Lent, the Priest wears rose colored vestments rather than the purple, and the hymns we sing of this joy that Jesus Christ took upon Himself all the sins of humanity to give us the worthiness of an eternity in heaven with God. The Communion Hymn is a treasured American Hymn which is a supplication to the Lord, that He "take our hand" and comfort us in sorrow now and at the time of death.

Life Matters

For the third year in a row, Governor Cuomo is trying to EXPAND abortion in New York State. This time he's camouflaged it inside the Budget bill. These provisions would remove limits on late-term abortion, empower non- doctors to perform abortions, eliminate defenses for women coerced into abortion and remove protections for babies mistakenly born alive! According to Kathleen Gallagher of the New York Catholic Conference, we should "not stand silent in the face of a misguided and extreme abortion agenda that will...undermine the health and dignity of women and children".
