The Offertory Hymn tells the story of the two disciples meeting Jesus on the road to Emmaus, although Emmaus is not specifically named in Luke's account.

Of course, we continue to praise the Risen Lord in both the Processional and Recessional Hymns. The Soloists sing of the Resurrection in a delightful Dutch Easter Carol. 


Catholic Media Kiosk
