We read of the imagery of planting seeds and by nurturing them, they grow to fruition The Responsorial Psalm, which uses the metaphor of the great cedar of Lebanon, through the Gospel, in which we hear of the man who scatters seeds and while asleep, the seeds germinate and grow to healthy plants. We hear also of the mustard seed, one of the smallest seeds which grow into a large tree. The metaphors throughout the readings are clear when placed aside the teaching that we must plant the seeds of faith, and thus cause our faith to grow. An interesting passage is that which says that Jesus did not explain the parables to his followers, but to his Disciples he explained the meaning and truths under the parables. It is as if Jesus is forming his Church so it will have the truth which its bishops and priests may teach without error. The Processional Hymn sings of this, the Offertory Hymn declares that we believe by faith and not by sight. The Communion Hymn sings as a people who pray that the Lord do with them as He wishes, to believe and to serve. The Recessional Hymn is a paraphrase of the great prayer, the Te Deum.

The Music Ministry humbly thanks the many people of our parish who expressed joy in our efforts in music for our Liturgies. As J.S. Bach said, "Solo Dei Gloria" (All for the Glory of God)
