As you might notice from the hymns today, the themes of the Gospel are apparent. We are called to spread the Good News of Christ who died for our sins, and of His Resurrection from the dead. Jesus sent his Disciples to preach in various towns, telling them that if they were not shown hospitality in a town that they should shake the dust from their feet and move on to another town. Although we now usually associate "hospitality" as a form of etiquette, in Jesus' time one welcomed strangers into one's home and at the table. Biblical hospitality demanded that the host honor and listen to the guest. In this way the disciples could discuss the teachings of their Master and these teachings may take root. But Jesus admonished them to not stay in a town where such hospitality is not offered.

The Communion Meditation sings of the assurance which the believer has with the knowledge that Jesus lives then and now, giving us the strength to face our daily challenges. The text:
"I believe in the Son, I believe in the Risen One, I believe I overcome by the power of His Blood. Amen, Amen, I am alive Because He Lives, Let my song join the one that never ends Because He Lives. Because He lives I can face tomorrow, Because He lives every fear is gone. I know he holds my life, my future in His hands."
