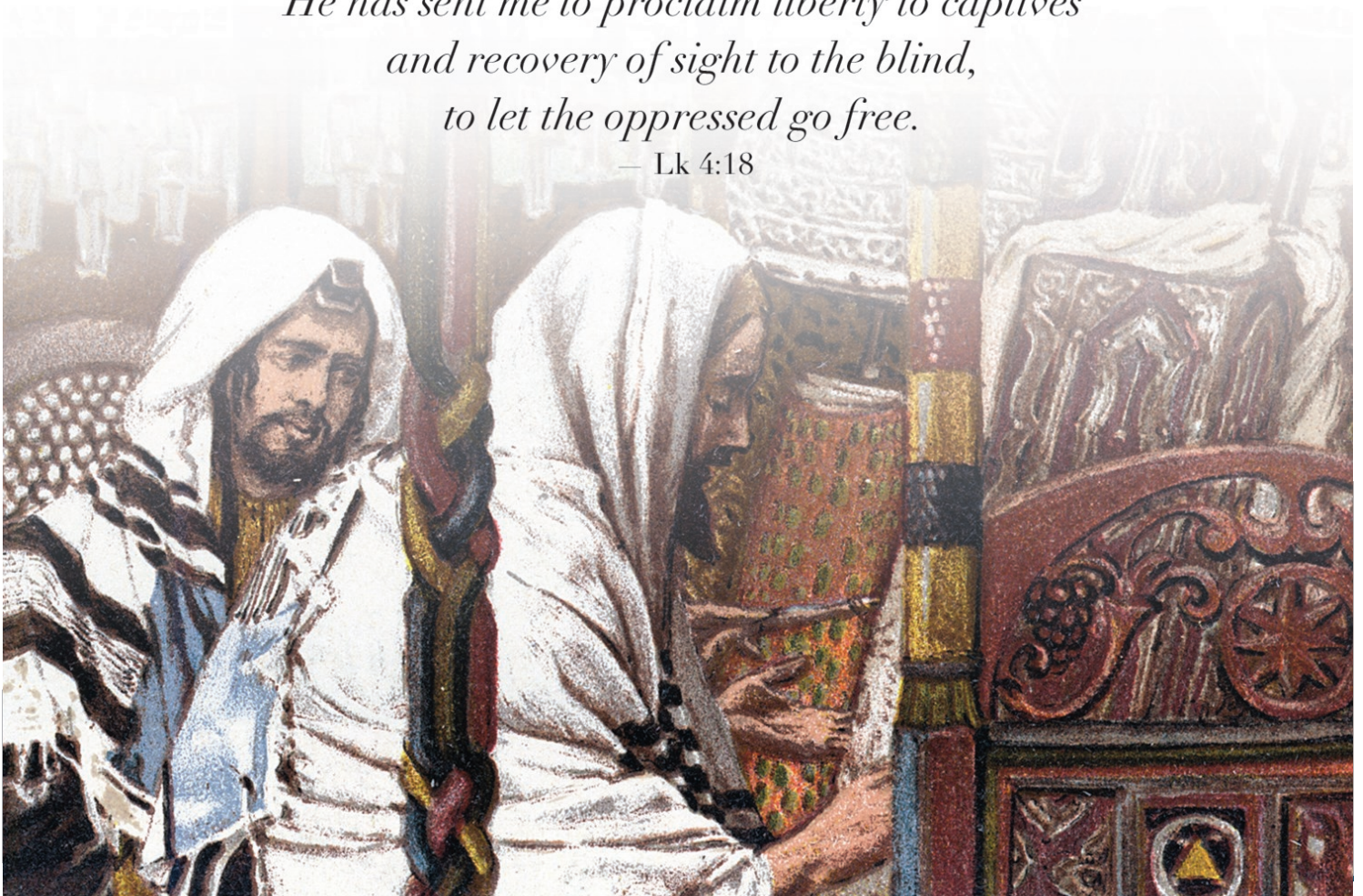

We are well into the Readings from the Gospel of St. Luke (Year C in the 3-year Liturgical Cycle). The first three Gospels are referred to as synoptic, because they narrate the chronological events of the Life of Jesus, His Ancestry, Birth, Public Ministry, Crucifixion, Death, Resurrection and Mandate to His Disciples to feed His sheep. However, each one of the Evangelists wrote from a different perspective since each preached to a different audience. Matthew, to a Jewish crowd, Mark to Romans, and Luke to Greeks. Interest in the Gospel (The Good News) was expanding to a larger world!

The Choir Anthem has a Scriptural text and concludes with the first verse of the classic and well-known hymn, **O God, Our Help In Ages Past**, No.442 in our Hymnal. Please join the Choir in singing this hymn when the appropriate time come.
