Overall, the readings of these early Sundays in Ordinary Time concern with discipleship. We learn about Jesus' ministry, and more than that, we are invited to become a part of it. The Offertory Hymn, "The Summons", addresses this exactly, as we ask in this hymn to follow his call and serve where we are needed and where He calls us to be. The Processional Hymn exclaims in great joy that the Love of God is greater than all other types of love. The Offertory Hymn is a musical setting of the Beatitudes, in which Jesus taught that all those who are meek of heart will inherit the Kingdom of Heaven. The Recessional Hymn shouts out with joy "How Great Thou Art". This hymn tune is actually a Swedish folk melody and is one of the most popular of all hymns. The Choir Anthem (11:30) is a setting of the Benediction prayer from Scripture, "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face to shine upon you and give you peace".

I have devoted much time in talking about the hymns today. Hopefully this will inspire you to really join in the singing of the Hymns and Responses. Don't just sit and listen to the Cantor or the Choir. Sing out loud with the voice God gave you! You will find great joy in this! I promise.

# From the Pastor

When a Catholic is ill - there are a set of sacraments that should be given to assist them. The Sacraments are:

- Anointing of the Sick (often misunderstood as "Last Rites") 1.
- 2. Penance or Confession, and the Eucharist. These sacraments are meant to:
- Anointing of the Sick—healing for body and soul.
- Penance bestow absolution.

Eucharist - spiritual food or if the person is dying the reception of Communion is known as Viaticum or "Food for the journey" to the Lord. Reception of the Eucharist as Viaticum is the only sacrament essentially associated with dying.

Suppose a Catholic dies suddenly or without these sacraments immediately prior to death? The Catholic Catechism says it well-"God is not bound by the sacraments".

Pope St. John Paul II in Reconciliatio - et Paenitentia offers these words of comfort-"God in His merciful love is greater than our hearts and can overcome all of our psychological and spiritual resistence. So that, as St. Thomas Aquinas writes: "considering the omnipotence and mercy of God, no one should despair of the salvation of anyone in this life".

Please don't wait to receive these sacraments when you or a loved one are sick. The misguided fear - "I don't want to scare the patient. If the priest comes they will think they are dying". These sacraments will immensely benefit the sick person often bringing a peace and healing that nothing else does.

(Besides, most people do live after talking with priests!)


