Dear Friends,

Today is a day to begin anew, to celebrate life, love and hope!

We are all children of God and He calls us by name. He longs for us to know Him, to know that we are loved always, unconditionally. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life."—John 3:16 There is no greater sign of God's love for us than to give us new life now, today and eternally.

Jail Ministry March Day of Service

Last week our Faith in Action event was at Jail Ministry Mary Relihan and I met with Keith Cieplicki & his staff. We helped with the phone lines and learned of their necessity in providing help and communication for the inmates at the downtown jail. Over 650 inmates are awaiting trial - they have not been convicted. They could be held in this jail for up to a year while awaiting trial to determine their innocence or guilt! They are suspected of of committing a crime, but poverty is an important factor in keeping them locked up. Despite their lack of money, inmates are charged \$5 per minute to make a local phone call. Jail Ministry provides human dignity to the inmates by visiting them and by providing free phone lines. Only one call per day is permitted, but the phones provide a vital link to the outside world - messages are communicated to lawyers or family members.
