Today we read the Parable of the Good Samaritan. This story reminds us of Jesus' mandate to the faithful that we help our suffering sisters and brothers in the name of Christ Jesus. These good works are referred to as the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and indeed, that is exactly what they are. Love is necessary for us to be good to our neighbors, be they rich or poor. This kind of love mentioned in Scripture is called "Agape", a love which is pure and encompassing. Jesus chose for His Parable a very unlikely person, a Samaritan, unlikely because Samaritans were essentially enemies of the Jewish people, and a Samaritan would have been thought of as one of the least likely persons to give such love to a Jew! So, we sing of love for our neighbor in our hymns, of being called to service in His Name, with the Holy Spirit guiding and strengthening us in our faith.

Today, our soloist, Mia Quatrone sings the beautiful and haunting "**God Bless The Child**" which sings of love for the poor of the world, be they near or far, especially the children who have little. It is a prayer that these children hopefully receive the love that riches cannot buy.

**Responding to the Call of Jesus Come Follow Me:
 Six Responses to the Call of Jesus -
 Monastic Spiritual Traditions and Prayer**

Do you ask yourself how can I more effectively pray? In 6 one- hour sessions we will learn about the ancient monastic spiritual traditions of the Benedictines, Cistercians, Carmelites, Dominicans, Franciscans and Jesuits. These sessions will also give us insight into the history of our church at certain critical times. For example, Ignatius of Loyola began the Society of Jesus just when it was needed because of the ignorance of authentic Catholicism. The first half- hour will consist of a video presentation by Albert Haase, OFM on the above-mentioned spiritual movements. For the last half- hour David Hines will lead a discussion on how these spiritualities can benefit our own individual prayer life.



The 6 sessions will be on Tuesday evenings from 7 to 8 PM in Yeazel Hall starting July 19 and running through August 23. There will be a \$13.00 registration fee that will be used for the book that will be a companion to our discussions on prayer: Thomas DuBay, S.M., *Prayer Primer, Igniting A Fire Within*.
