"Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you", says Jesus in today's Gospel. We are asked to be hospitable to all, and caring to all with whom we come in contact. We must love our neighbor and love our God with all being. The Hymns today sing of this. **The Communion Meditation, sung by our baritone soloist, Ryan Boyle, is a setting of the beloved hymn** *How Great Thou Art*, in which we praise the might of God and the beauty of the natural wonders that He has created.

To restate what was mentioned last week: The Rubrics (Liturgical Directions) of the Roman Missal state that an appropriate time for a Choir Anthem and/or vocal solo is at the end of and after Communion so the assembly can meditate on its message. During the Offertory is also an appropriate time. So, at times during the Mass we sing, and at other times we listen to the homily and musical offerings after the Solo or Choir Anthem, there should be a brief period of silence to commune with the Lord who has come Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, the Real Presence in the Eucharist. What a perfect balance in worship.

We begin the hour on Wednesdays with adoration & will conclude with **Evening Prayer** from the Divine Office at 7:45pm followed by Solemn Benediction.


Responding to the Call of Jesus Come Follow Me: Six Responses to the Call of Jesus -Monastic Spiritual Traditions and Prayer

Do you ask yourself how can I more effectively pray? In 6 one- hour sessions we will learn about the ancient monastic spiritual traditions of the Benedictines, Cistercians, Carmelites, Dominicans, Franciscans and Jesuits. These sessions will also give us insight into the history of our church at certain critical times. For example, Ignatius of Loyola began



the Society of Jesus just when it was needed because of the ignorance of authentic Catholicism. The first half- hour will consist of a video presentation by Albert Haase, OFM on the abovementioned spiritual movements. For the last half- hour David Hines will lead a discussion on how these spiritualties can benefit our own individual prayer life.

The 6 sessions will be on Tuesday evenings from 7 to 8 PM in Yeazel Hall through August 23. There will be a \$13.00 registration fee that will be used for the book that will be a companion to our discussions on prayer: Thomas DuBay, S.M., *Prayer Primer, Igniting A Fire Within.* The registration fee can be paid by check or by cash, by handing it in the office, or at the beginning of the classes. Year of Mercy 2016

During the month of July, Faith in Action at Holy Cross sought ways that we could show their love & care for homeless men. We prepared a hot breakfast at Catholic Charities Men's shelter on July 10th & we walked the streets with Emmaus Ministry on July 23 to express our solidarity with those who have no home.

Coming in August: we ask your prayers and actions in support of women and children in need. Faith in Action will collect school supplies for an organization called Mothers and Children in Crisis. Later in August, Joseph's House will be here to ask for our support. There are many ways to support struggling women & children - please look through the options listed below and choose a way that you & your family can provide mercy to suffering women & children in our community.

Refugee Committee request for gently used children's clothing: Our refugee committee is staffing the clothing closet at Catholic Charities Refugee Resettlement on Tuesday mornings. The committee is seeking donations of gently used children's clothing. Please leave your donations in the downstairs closet by the elevator.

Mothers and Children in Crisis (McC):

This organization seeks to provide support for trafficked women who desire to make a change in their lives. The support includes positive change by helping mothers during drug treatment, to seek employment, & to provide for the immediate needs of their children. McC is planning a "back to school" party on August 17th. They are asking you to help to fill a backpack with school supplies for the children at the party. When purchasing school supplies for you family, please purchase an extra item for a child in need. Some items requested: spiral notebooks, wide-ruled paper, crayons or markers, wipes, scissors, kleenex boxes, pencils, erasers, glue sticks, a thumb drive, ziplock bags, colored pencils or a backpack. Donations will be collected in the gathering space in a box labeled "**McC**" during the first two weeks of August.

Baby Bottle Drive to benefit Joseph's House, August 20 &21

Representatives from Joseph's House will be at Holy Cross Church handing out baby bottles at all the exits after the masses. Simply fill your baby bottle with a donation and return it to bins which will be located at the exits of the church within 30 days.
