And what I saw that week was this: young people choosing to put others first. Because we know that as long as there is someone standing in front of us, our mission is to love that person. For Christ has said, "Love one another as I have loved you" John 15:12.

Today's readings teach that the storing up of riches does not constitute achieving an eternal reward from God. We are called to serve our fellow human beings. There is nothing wrong with having beautiful things which make us happy, as long as the love of such things over all else does not dominate all aspects of our lives. "Vanity of vanities!" spoken of in the First Reading, teaches us what is to be avoided. The Gospel encourages us to seek the riches which bring us closer to God.

Thus, our hymns reflect Holy Scripture. We are called to service in His Name, while the Processional Hymn exclaims all of nature singing and proclaiming the Lord. The Communion Meditation by our soloist, Liam Fitzpatrick, is from Mendelssohn's Oratorio, "Elijah", and underlines the message in today's Gospel. The text is: "'If with all your hearts ye truly seek Me, ye shall ever surely find Me', thus saith God. Oh, that I knew where I might find Him, that I might even come before His presence. 'If with all your hearts ye truly seek Me, ye shall ever surely find Me', thus saith our God". How perfectly this emphasizes today's Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading and Gospel, that rather than looking for only worldly riches, we must seek out the Lord our God, and we shall find Him!

Responding to the Call of Jesus Come Follow Me: Six Responses to the Call of Jesus Monastic Spiritual Traditions and Prayer

Do you ask yourself how can I more effectively pray? In 6 one- hour sessions we will learn about the ancient monastic spiritual traditions of the Benedictines, Cistercians, Carmelites, Dominicans, Franciscans and Jesuits. These sessions will also give us insight into the history of our church at certain critical times. For example, Ignatius of Loyola began



the Society of Jesus just when it was needed because of the ignorance of authentic Catholicism. The first half- hour will consist of a video presentation by Albert Haase, OFM on the abovementioned spiritual movements. For the last half- hour David Hines will lead a discussion on how these spiritualties can benefit our own individual prayer life.

The 6 sessions will be on Tuesday evenings from 7 to 8 PM in Yeazel Hall through August 23.
