As St. Paul's Letter to Timothy approaches its conclusion today, he gives thanks to God for saving him from the lion's mouth. Some commentaries suggest that Paul was not speaking about his execution in the Coliseum, but about the philosophers of the day who were often referred to as "animals". In the Letter's conclusion (vss. 19-22), Paul asks Timothy to say hello to Prisca and Aquila. They were frequent companions and co-workers of Paul who travelled with him to Rome, Corinth and Ephesus, and were tent-makers, as Paul was.
