What are the Groups who Support the Pastor/ Administrator/Parish Life Director in the Care of the Parish and its Ministries?

It is made up of lay members of the parish with expertise in these matters. They work for the good of the parish and its ministry.

The **Parish Pastoral Council** is mandated by the bishop for each parish in the diocese. This council in conjunction with the pastor/administrator/parish life director, works to foster the pastoral ministry of the parish. They do this by creating a vision and a sense of mission for the whole community.

A **Parish Ministry Council** may be created to support and coordinate parish programs, activities and events. Their work is to collaborate and communicate with parish organizations to support the vision and mission of the parish.
