We enter the season of Lent as we take stock of our lives and express penitence for our sins. We invite the Lord to live within us. We refrain from singing "Alleluia", we omit the "Gloria" and rather than a Recessional Hymn, there will be quiet instrumental or choral music as the priest and servers recess quietly. Perhaps we can also keep a reverent quiet after Mass during Lent. Even the organ is quieter and used less.

Interestingly, today's First Reading brings us the story of Creation from Genesis, set in the beautiful Garden of Eden. Contrast this with today's Gospel from St. Matthew which takes place in a barren desert. Jesus has nothing, not even a crust of bread. When tempted by the devil, he refuses. The Children (9:00) sing a song of forgiveness and the sin of bullying. The Choir (11:30) sings, "Let not your heart be troubled, but believe in God. Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you."
