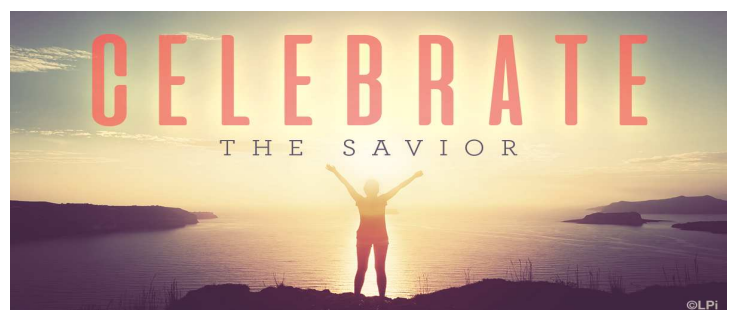

Brady Bread Sale: next weekend

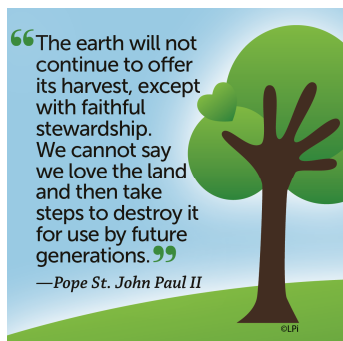
