Their dedication and talent is a main reason for our Liturgies being of a quality worthy of the praise of the Lord. I regularly remind them that their work is a ministry which reaches so many of the parishioners every week. They sing for the glory of God, to lead and inspire their fellow parishioners in song, and to receive a blessing from God in doing so.

This week we return to Ordinary Time, the longest period in the Liturgical year, It is called Ordinary Time because it is this time when Sundays are counted using ordinal numbers (e.g. 12th, 13th, etc.). We return to Matthew's Gospel, Chapter 10, and we will continue to hear portions proclaimed each week to the end of Chapter 15 on the 20th Sunday. In Ordinary Time. We will also continue to read and listen to Paul's Letter to the Romans, Chapters 5 through 11.

If you enjoy a rousing march, plan to stay a few minutes after Masses on the weekend of July 1 and 2 and July 4. The Postlude will be *The Liberty Bell* by John Philip Sousa who has been hailed and revered around the world as "The King of Marches". Other countries have produced composers who worked in the idiom, but none have surpassed Sousa in popularity or frequency of performance. Next week's "Musical Notes" will include some interesting facts about the composer and his stirring marches!
