The readings today have to do with our thirsting for The Lord. The reading from Jeremiah is of course pessimistic in nature as he feels that the Lord duped him and the word of the Lord has brought him "derision and reproach all the day". Following is the Responsorial Psalm which cheers things up as the Psalmist gazes toward the Lord in the sanctuary while the final verses are so comforting and uplifting and they bear repeated readings after Mass.

In the Offertory Hymn "Only This I Want" echoes the Gospel reading which requires no explanation. And the praise hymns are always appropriate during this or any time of year.
