Some really good news: In Sept. the NY State Court of Appeals has ruled 5-0 that the NY law prohibiting assisted suicide applies to all **-no exceptions** - and reaffirms the logical distinction between refusing life-sustaining treatment & actively assisting in suicide. "This is a victory for those most at risk of abuse & most susceptible to pressure including the isolated elderly & persons with disabilities or overcome with hopelessness" (Catholic New York, 9/14/17, <http://tinyurl.com/y7n59lug>).

The Spirituality of Saint Paul: An Advent Study

In this study we will explore key Biblical passages from the early church’s most influential evangelist and discover the rich spiritual tradition of Paul that continues to influence us today. Paul draws us into the power of Jesus’ cross and resurrection not only in our lives but also in the lives of key historical figures that embodied Paul’s spirituality. During this Advent season we are once again preparing for the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is well to also dwell on why Jesus came into the world; Saint Paul powerfully translates the message of the cross for first century Christians and to us as well.

There will be four sessions on Paul’s spirituality on **Wednesday evenings in Yeazel Hall—rms. 12 & 13 from 7- 8:30 PM, on October 16th 23rd 30th and November 3rd**. There will be a study guide that will cost \$16.00 that includes a commentary by Father Patrick J. Hartin, an ordained priest of the Diocese of Spokane, Washington and a professor at Gonzaga University. A check for the amount of \$16.00 can be made out to Holy Cross Church, or cash can be brought to our first session. We will see a brief video by a number of noted lecturers and a discussion will follow. David Hines will facilitate the sessions. 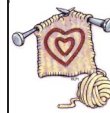
