Syracuse University's Enactus students will be selling Guatemala Mayan weavers' products after Masses on **December 2 & 3**. The average income for Mayan families in Guatemala is under \$3 a day, and the cost of attending secondary school can reach \$250 a year. As a result, less than one percent of Mayan girls graduate from high school. Since 2007, SU Enactus students have provided over 300 scholarships through the sale of the Mayan weavers' products.
