People born with a uterus...

External Anatomy

Anus - Stretchy, asterix-like opening to the rectum.

Clitoral hood - A fold of skin that sits on top of the clitoris.

Clitoris - A small roundish bulb that sits near the top of the labia, and a small shaft that extends back under the clitoral hood. The clitoris is extremely sensitive to touch and other stimulation.

Outer Labia/Outer Lips - Folds of thicker skin on both sides of the vulva. During puberty they often develop pubic hair. They help protect the clitoris, urethral opening and vaginal opening.

Inner Labia/Inner Lips - Thinner folds of skin that sit inside the the outer labia. They may be shorter, longer or the same length as the outer lips and usually do not have hair.

Mons - Soft, fatty tissue above the vulva that covers the pubic bone. Pubic often grows to cover the mons during puberty.

Urethral Opening - A very small opening above the vagina that allows the passage of urine.

Vaginal Opening - A larger opening located near the base of the vulva which is the entryway to the vagina. Vaginal lubrication and menstrual blood leave the body through this opening.

Vulva - A collective name for the outer lips, inner lips, urethral opening, vaginal opening and the clitoris.

Internal Anatomy

Cervix - The opening from the uterus into the upper part of the vagina.

Clitoral legs - A long wishbone shaped structure that extends down behind the vaginal wall.

Fallopian Tubes - Eggs travel along this passageway to get to the uterus.

Ovaries - Gonads responsible for the production of the hormones estrogens and progesterone.

Rectum - An 8 to 9 inch tube that is the passageway for feces.

Urethra - A tube that begins at the bladder carries urine out of the body.

Uterus - A pear-shaped muscular organ, about the size of a fist. It sheds it's lining during menstruation and houses a fetus during pregnancy.

Vagina - A passageway from the cervix to the outside of the vaginal opening.

People born with testicles...

External Anatomy

Anus - The entryway into the rectum.

Foreskin - Covers the glans/head of the penis totally or partially unless it's removed via circumcision.

Glans/Head - acorn shaped bulb at the tip of the penis

Penile shaft - The longer part of the penis which extends out from the body. It is filled with spongy tissue and may respond to stimulation by becoming hard or erect.

Penis - A collective name for the penile shaft, head and urethral opening.

Scrotum - A sac of skin that holds, protects and help regulate the temperature of the testicles.

Urethral Opening - A very small opening at the tip of the glans that allows the passage of urine or semen.

Internal Anatomy

Epididymis - Tightly coiled tubes that cover the top of the testicles and store sperm.

Rectum - An 8 to 9 inch tube that is the passageway for feces.

Testicles/Testes - The gonads responsible for producing sperm and testosterone.

Urethra - A passageway for urine from the bladder that runs along the inside of the penis.

Vas deferens - Passageway for sperm leading from the testicles to the urethra.
