Materials required for optional crinoline slip: All sizes: 1/3 yard 45"-wide white cotton; 1.5 yards 45"-wide crinoline or stiff tulle netting up to size 6;

2 yards for 8-12; 2.5 yards 14-16. Enough 1/4" elastic to go around the child's waist.

**Fabric suggestions:** Cotton, gingham, Oxford shirting, batiste, linen, rayon.

**Notes:** 

Be sure to pre-wash and iron all washable fabrics before cutting out your pattern pieces.

Wide ribbon for the waistline (one yard is plenty for all sizes). Trim suggestions:

**Notions:** 1/2 yard lightweight fusible interfacing; thread; 3-6 3/8" buttons (see section 5 in the instructions).

\* I've separated the bodice and skirt yardages so you can mix and match sizes for a perfect fit. Be sure to see my introductory remarks in the pattern instructions for further assistance.

5/8" seam allowed on all seams, except on bodice dart.
