

October 1, 2016 HUD/Federal Fiscal Year Data Standards Changes


Summary of All Changes Impacting Data Collection and Data Entry

This document outlines the changes to Minnesota's HMIS effective October 1, 2016. ServicePoint will be updated to align with the changes and new data collection forms will be available at https://mismn.org/forms/. Throughout this document, you'll see numbers in parentheses following the name of a data element; these align with the HUD Data Standards. Changes only affect clients still enrolled in your project as of October 1, 2016 and new clients going forward. ServicePoint Instructions are geared towards HMIS Users/data entry staff.

Changes to Universal Data Elements - All Funding Sources/Programs

Gender (3.6)


The "other" option is being changed to "Doesn't identify as male, female or transgender." **ServicePoint Instruction**: You can use this field going forward. Any previous "Other" responses will be changed accordingly.



Disabling Condition (3.8)

This question used to be required for adults only. It is now required for all clients.

ServicePoint Instruction: You were not asked to collect this data element for children upon intake (before 10/1/2016). Collect and enter this data element for children according to what was true for the client at entry. Answer this data element in the client's Entry Assessment in the Entry/Exit tab.



Living Situation (3.917A and 3.917B)

This element combines the previous Residence Prior to Project Entry (3.9) and Length of Time on the Streets, in an Emergency Shelter or in a Safe Haven (3.17) to allow for a more logical workflow and to better identify chronically homeless persons. This element will have two subparts: one for Street Outreach, Emergency Shelter & Safe Haven projects (3.917A), and another for all other project types (3.917B).

See Appendix A for details.

ServicePoint Instruction: This data element is the most significant change and will use conditional formatting in ServicePoint. Read more in Appendix A. Previously added responses to 3.9 and 3.17 will be mapped to 3.917. However, we recommend checking that all your data is entered.

Changes to Program Specific Data Elements – Common to Most Funding Sources/Programs

Health Insurance (4.4)

"Indian Health Services Program" and "Other" are being added as sources to this subassessment.

ServicePoint Instruction: If your funding source requires you to complete the Health Insurance sub-assessment, you will be required to update the HUD Verification for clients in your program as of October 1st. For new clients, these options will be added to the current list of sources but not require a change to your workflow.




Appendix A: Living Situation (3.917A and 3.917B)

Emergency Shelter and Street Outreach Projects ONLY (3.917A)

The questions beginning with "Residence Prior to Project Entry" have not changed and do not include conditional logic.



However, the options for "Length of Stay in Previous Place" have changed.



For All Other Project Types (3.917B)

The questions beginning with "Residence Prior to Project Entry" have changed and include conditional logic based on a client's answers to Residence Prior to Project Entry (A) and Length of Stay at Prior Living Situation (B).



Residence Prior to Project Entry

Pick ONLY ONE under literally homeless, institutional, OR transitional and permanent housing. This responds to where the client stayed the night before entering the project. There are three categories:


- 1. Literally Homeless Situation (Read about the conditional formatting if a client selects this situation on: Page 6)
- 2. **Institutional Situation** (Read about the conditional formatting if a client selects this situation on: Page 8)
- 3. **Transitional and Permanent Housing** (Read about the conditional formatting if a client selects this situation on: Page 10)

1. If Residence Prior to Project Entry = a Literally Homeless Situation



Interim Housing (New response option) = Interim housing is not a type of housing but rather a housing situation where a chronically homeless person has: applied for permanent housing, has been accepted, a unit/voucher for permanent housing has been reserved for them, but for which there is some other situation that prevents them from moving immediately into housing (e.g. apartment getting painted, old tenant moving out, has a voucher but is looking for the unit, etc.). In such cases, where it has been determined to be absolutely necessary that to keep the client engaged and moving towards housing a temporary solution must be utilized and transitional housing is used the client should then be identified upon move in to the permanent house as coming from "interim housing". This will enable that individual/household to be identified as chronically homeless at intake for reporting purposes based on the responses to the elements that will follow. Note: This housing is not a substitute for a waiting list or for any situation other than identified here.


If one of these answers is selected, additional questions are shown that must be answered. The answers for "Length of Stay in Previous Place" have changed:




For a Homeless Situation, it also asks for "Approximate date homelessness started". Answer this the same as before (the approximate or actual date the client started living in that "homeless situation" immediately before entering the project).




The "Regardless of where they stayed last night..." and "Total number of months homeless..." questions show up for a Homeless Situation answer as well. Again, answer these as you normally have.




2. If Residence Prior to Project Entry = an Institutional Situation




If one of these answers is selected, additional questions are shown that must be answered. The answers for "Length of Stay in Previous Place" have changed:




Depending the answer, the "Did you stay less than 90 days" answer will automatically default to "Yes" or "No". If the answer to "Did you stay less than 90 days" is "Yes", then there is an additional question that shows:




If the answer to the above question is "Yes", then the additional questions of "Approximate date...", "Regardless of where they stayed last night...", and "Total number of months homeless..." appear to be answered. This is because if a client stayed in an Institutional Situation for less than 90 days and was experiencing homelessness on the streets or in shelter immediately before going into that Institutional Situation, the stay in the Institutional Situation does not constitute a break in their length of homelessness.



If the answer to "On the night before did you stay on the streets, ES, or SH?" is No, then the other questions do not appear and you can move on with the assessment.




3. If Residence Prior to Project Entry = Transitional and Permanent Housing Situation




If one of these answers is selected, additional questions are shown that must be answered. The answers for "Length of Stay in Previous Place" have changed:

Depending on the answer to the question above, the "Did you stay less than 7 nights?" answer will automatically default to "Yes" or "No". If the answer to "Did you stay less than 7 nights?" Is "Yes", then the question "On the night before did you stay on the streets, ES or SH?" will show to answer.



If the answer to "On the night before did you stay on the streets, ES or SH?" is Yes, then the "Approximate date...", "Regardless of where they stayed last night...", and "Total number of months homeless..." questions will show to answer.



If the answer to "Length of Stay in Previous Place" is more than 7 nights, the answer to "Did you stay less than 7 nights" defaults to "No" and the additional questions do not show to be answered and you can move on with the assessment.
