


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The Way, The Truth, The Life

hirty three years ago I went on a search for God...and truth. I was raised in a traditional Jewish home and was taught to believe in God. I did believe. But I knew that I did not know Him. I imagined God up there...somewhere...and in my young mind, I knew there must be some way to know Him.

I also knew that, if He could be known, He must have given us a way for that to happen. I guess I was protected from the idea that there are many ways to God. I could not fathom a personal God who would create us and not give us some direction on how to have a relationship with Him.

As my story goes, when I was in college I "stole" a Gideon's Bible from a Motel Six in Raleigh, NC...and began to read. Through my reading of the messianic prophecies in the Old Testament, and then my reading of the New Testament book of Matthew, I became a believer in Jesus as Messiah. I fell in love with a Rabbi. I knew that I had found the truth and immediately knew that the truth I had found was not only for me, but for all people. I was then called to take the message back to my Jewish people. The journey began.

There was an interesting article in the Atlanta Journal Constitution a few years back. In bold letters the headline proclaimed, "Christian Group says Jews Don't Need Jesus." No new idea here. Throughout the centuries men have debated whether people need to believe in Jesus in order to have a relationship with God. This issue, for many who call themselves Christians, becomes more of a dilemma when discussing the Jewish people. It is easier to say that those of other faiths or religions, who are not Jewish, need to be reached with Jesus. But, God's



chosen people? God would not keep THEM out of heaven if they don't accept Jesus...would He?

This group of "Christians" decided that Jesus is for everyone BUT the Jewish people. They stated that because God made a covenant with the Jewish people in the Old Testament through Abraham, Jewish people are "saved" by virtue of that covenant (called the Duel Covenant theory), and do not need Jesus to go to heaven. They also repudiated any form of attempts to bring Jesus to the Jewish community. Unfortunately prominent within Christendom leaders have. throughout the centuries, been proponents of Duel Covenant theology.

After reading the article I began to wonder what I was doing with my life and whether, because of their decision, I was out of a job! Of course, their decision was wrong and based upon an erroneous reading of the Bible. What they decided is not true and, in fact, is the most anti-Semitic decision that could be made. Their decision is stating that either Jesus is not good enough for my people or my Jewish people are not good enough for Jesus. As we celebrate the birth of "the way, the truth, and the life" this month, let me give you some thoughts on the nature of truth and the Gospel.

◆ We live in a world where most people believe that there are many ways to God. Some say Christians have their way to God; Jews, Hindus, Buddhists, Muslims, and other people have their way. Truth has been relegated to the realm of the subjective. Truth, it is believed, is relative to the person who believes it. There is not one way to God, but many. The problem with the position is that if truth is relative to the person who believes it, then we have no way of judging which truth is the right truth. Truth, therefore, becomes meaningless.

The reality is that spiritual truth is not subjective and can be objectively known. Right and wrong can be known because God gave us His view on right and wrong, truth and falsehood, in His Word. The scriptures are the only Godbreathed, authoritative, objective means, for us to discern right from wrong and good from evil. Therefore, we can determine what is right and wrong, true or false, from Scripture. The Ten Commandments are not subjective. They are mandatory rules for living a godly life. The Bible also gives us a picture of the nature of God and man. God is holy and just, man is separated from God because of sin.

• Jesus cannot be the "way" for the Gentiles and not for the Jewish people. If Jesus is true, His truth has to be for everyone, not just for the Gentiles. Either he is "the way, the truth, and the life" for all or He is a false god, who should be rejected by all.

◆ Jewish people need Jesus, just like everyone else. In the Book of Acts, Peter said, "*There is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.*" (Acts 4:12) Salvation in Jesus alone is the cornerstone of true Christianity. No one who says there are many ways to God, or that any person can go to heaven apart from Jesus, under-

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stands the Gospel. Jesus came as the Jewish Messiah. He said to His disciples at the Last Supper (a Passover Seder—order of service), "*I am the way, the truth, and the life, and no man comes to the Father but through Me.*" (John 14:16) He came as foretold by the Jewish prophets. He lived in a Jewish land, spoke to the Jewish people when He was here, and proclaimed Himself Messiah. Jesus wept over Jerusalem, as the Jewish prophets of the Old Testament did before Him. But He wept as "God on earth." His tears were the very tears of God Himself.

◆ Jewish evangelism is not an option, it is an imperative. When Jesus sent His disciples out He said, "Do not go the way of the Gentiles, but go first to the Lost Sheep of the House of Israel." (Matthew 10:5) Jesus sent His disciples out beginning in Jerusalem (to the Jewish people), then to Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

The Apostle Paul showed his understanding of the importance of reaching Jewish people with the message of Jesus as Messiah when he said in Romans 1:16 that the gospel was the power of God for salvation for all who believe "to the Jew first, and also to the Gentile." To show his great desire for Jewish people to know Jesus, as an apostle to the Gentiles, Paul made it his practice to always begin his proclamation of Jesus in the synagogue everywhere he went. If the Apostle Paul modeled Jewish evangelism in his ministry, we must also model Jewish evangelism in our mission efforts.

As you celebrate the birthday of our Savior please remember that my people need the Savior too!
