urs is a relatively simple ministry. We talk to Jewish people about Jesus. And we help other people do the same. Sometimes the whole concept is misunderstood. Most people connect the proclamation of the gospel to "good works" or "helps ministry". I have discussed this before in my letters. For the most part, our ministry is not a ministry that feeds the poor, educates the uneducated, or helps the homeless. Most Jewish people don't need those things.

Our Russian ministry is a bit different in that Russian Jewish people are in more need of care. Our English classes are one way we reach them with the message of Jesus. They need to learn how to speak English, we help them, and at the same time share our faith, hope, and testimony.

But, for the most part, we are singly focused. We share the gospel with Jewish people, meet with Jewish seekers, and help Christians share their faith with their Jewish friends in a more effective way.

Along the line we see Jewish people come to faith and become fruitful disciples of the Lord. That is the most exciting part of the work that we do.

I have had a letter sitting on my desk for one year. Occasionally I read it to remind myself of the impact our ministry has had and is having. When I get discouraged or feel fatigued, I read the letter and it helps me to regain my fo-



cus. It helps me to remember that God is using our ministry in mighty ways to impact lives.
