Joined Together



It is not unusual for us to receive a letter like this at our office. The lady who wrote the letter (and gave us permission to reprint) is married to a Jewish man who does not yet know the Lord. One can feel her passion for her husband to come the know his Messiah and her sadness that they are not spiritually one. She is not alone. Over the years we have ministered to many women just like her.



Recently we have:

- Met with several people who are either married to or dating Jewish people who do not yet know the Lord.
- Met with Jewish people married to Christians.
- Counseled a Christian mother whose teenage son is confused. Her husband is Jewish and the son is torn in two different directions.
- Heard tragic stories of marriages in turmoil, relationships that are breaking, and children who are confused, because of interfaith relationships.

According to the most recent demographic numbers over 50% of Jewish people are married to someone who is not Jewish. Because of these statistics our ministry is responding to the needs of these interfaith marriages. We are called on a regular basis by professing Christians contemplating

marriage to a Jewish person who does not know the Lord. We also receive calls on a regular basis from Christians who have already married Jewish people desperately needing help for their unique circumstances. Ministry to interfaith couples is an increasingly important aspect of what we do.

Why is ministry to interfaith couples so important?

- spiritual needs. Usually both partners in an interfaith relationship have little connection to their family's religion. The fact that they are dating or married outside of their "faith" is an indication that they are not committed to the religion in which they were raised. Because of the lack of connectedness to religion in general, interfaith couples need to establish a common spiritual foundation.
- ♦ Interfaith couples have unique family needs. Even if the couple agrees to "respect the other person's spiritual position", over time, issues arise which may cause tension. The birth of a child, a terminal illness, and family gatherings, all present unique circumstances for the family. As the relationship grows, spouses begin to reevaluate how they want to raise their children and celebrated the holidays. Many of these issues can bring stress into the relationship.

Our ministry is uniquely equipped to help couples who come from two different backgrounds. And, it is our goal to point them into the direction of Jesus.

At a recent national conference on Jewish evangelism in Dallas, TX we were introduced to a new video produced by Chosen People Ministries (another ministry to the Jewish people) addressing the issue of interfaith marriages. The video, "Joined Together", documents the stories of several interfaith couples. Each couple has their own unique experience. Each couple struggles with issues common to interfaith relationships. And, all of the couples go on spiritual journeys to find the answers.

During the movie many at the conference were in tears as the couples unfold their lives and stories. Then, each couple comes to understand that their marriage and family could only be healed through a relationship with God through the Messiah Jesus. The video is professionally done and designed to give to interfaith couples who may be asking questions.

The "Joined Together" video is a powerful tool to use in sharing the hope of Jesus with an interfaith couple. A workbook can be used with the video to facilitate a personal study or group Bible study to discuss the issue. "Joined Together" is designed for believers to share with their friends who are in interfaith relationships. It is a video that offers hope, comfort, and answers.

Bert shares the following story:

Bonnie is a believer who attends my local church and is married to a Jewish man, Joe. Joe has not been very interested in discussing spiritual matters at all. Bonnie came to me and asked if I knew of any way to talk to Joe about God and especially Jesus. She had tried but he was just not ready to listen. I suggested she take a copy of the "Joined Together" video, view it, and then watch it with him. Bonnie thought this was a great idea. Two weeks after they watched the movie, her daughter was baptized and Joe came. He has been attending church ever since. I am still working on meeting with him oneon-one. Please pray that God will continue to soften his heart.
