What a creative e-mail! I got a good laugh out of it. But the e-mail also gives us a very sad picture of what many people think about the spiritual realm. To many people, the existence of God, the reality of spiritual conflict, and the power of prayer, is irrational, delusional, and foolish. But scripture tells us that the issues pertaining to the Kingdom of God will be looked at as foolishness to those in the world. This e-mail is a vivid reminder of how many people look at spiritual issues.

Of course, we believe that we are in a spiritual battle and that the battle is being fought in the heavenly realm. We are exhorted in the book of Ephesians, "For our struggle is not

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against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realm." There are forces at work in the spiritual realm that want to discourage us from a forthright witness, prevent us from reaching the lost, and undermine our efforts to bring the gospel to those in need. Therefore, scripture says, "Pray in the spirit on all occasions, with all kinds of prayers and requests." Prayer is a powerful tool that God has given us to make an impact in the world around us.

Given this spiritual truth, those of us who know Jesus also know that we can fight, we can battle, we can see fruit in the spiritual realm and for the Kingdom, through the most powerful resource we have, which is prayer. In our ministry we acknowledge the power of prayer to knit us together with the heart of our Father. I often say that we would not be able to do what we do without our supporters standing with us regularly with their prayers. And I am always blessed when someone comes up to me to tell

me that they pray for our ministry on a regular basis.

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Our ministry is always looking for new and powerful ways to include our supporters in what we are doing on a practical level. We want to partner with local churches for the purpose of helping Jewish people come to know Jesus as Messiah. Our Shalom Basket outreach is but one of the ministries which we have designed to include Christians in our efforts. We are now embarking on a new and regular outreach which will tap into the most powerful tool that God has given to us, the power of prayer.

Beginning on Saturday, October 8th we will be conducting quarterly prayer walks in the Jewish community, asking God to soften hearts, open doors, and give us fruit for His kingdom. A prayer walk is a very spiritual, powerful, way of connecting with the Jewish people and with the heart of God. During our prayer walks, which will be conducted in Jewish neighborhoods around Atlanta, we will be praying for the community and asking God to expand our territory.

Many people are afraid to talk to Jewish people about Jesus. Approaching a Jewish person is seen as confrontational, uncomfortable, and scary. We understand that. However, prayer walking is a nonconfrontational way to impact the Jewish community. It is a powerful way to be active in the lives of Jewish people. It is the most effective way to tap into the power that God has given to us to change lives. Are you afraid of talking to people about Jesus? You can praver walk with us!

Let me explain how a prayer walk works, what it is, and what it isn't.

What is a prayer walk?

A prayer walk is an intentional time of walking through a Jewish neighborhood and praying for the people. It is a powerful way of ministering to Jewish people by beseeching the Lord on their behalf. It is a spiritually strengthening and encouraging time. It is one of the most powerful ways to be involved in Jewish ministry. It is designed to be inclusive of all believers who have a heart for the Jewish community or for a Jewish person.

How does a prayer walk work?

During our prayer walks we gather at a predetermined meeting place in a Jewish neighborhood. Everyone dresses in casual clothing. No one is identified as a Christian, therefore we do not wear "evangelistic clothing". We are not there to talk to people. We are there to pray for them. After praying together, we split up into groups of two or three and begin to walk through the neighborhood. Many people like to carry scripture verses with them to pray over the community. Teams may walk through grocery stores, outside of synagogues and schools, and through the neighborhoods. People pray as the walk, either out loud or to themselves. People may bring up something to their team that the Lord lays on their heart to pray. After an hour or so of walking around the Jewish neighborhood we all return to our meeting spot, close in prayer, and return home.

A prayer walk is not an overtly evangelistic endeavor. We do not "witness" to Jewish people. We do not enter into spiritual discussions. We are merely there for the purpose of praying.

I want to be perfectly clear, praying for people is no substitute for talking to them about Jesus. Praying should not be looked at as the easy way to witness. The Gospel still needs to be proclaimed verbally, sensitively,



and forthrightly. However, prayer walking is a great way to begin the process.

We invite you to partner with us in intentional on-site intercession/ prayer in strategic locations in our local Jewish community. You can join us as an individual, a Sunday school class, or a church team. Call or email our office for more information! No experience is necessary! If you can pray you can come. Please consider it.
