
Doug's Drash from Doug Seserman, President and CEO

This holiday season Federation sent two very important missions to Israel. The first was a Public Officials Mission where 10 legislators and one of the Governor's staffers from Colorado traveled to Israel to experience the commonality and shared interests between these two locations. With the challenging water situations, the ingenuity of the citizens, and advances in alternative energy solutions, these lawmakers from Colorado learned a lot from the Israelis. This program complies with Amendment 41 that limits contributions to Colorado lawmakers while offering them an important opportunity to expand and enrich Colorado/Israel relations. Many participants came back refreshed, renewed and with a greater understanding of the complexities of that region of the world. This is an extension of the Memorandums of Understanding that were signed by Former Governor Ritter last year.

Denver Young Adult Leaders Work Hard in Lod

A few days after our officials returned, seven young adults were off to Lod in Israel to make an impact with their hard work and







tireless efforts. These young adults landed in Israel and went straight to work. They helped refurbish the unused third floor of the Elyashiv Boys High School run by Garin Hatorani in Lod. This space became a learning and hang-out facility for the Ethiopian National Project's (ENP) Scholastic Assistance Program of Lod. Fourty percent of the students at this school are of Ethiopian decent and 75 percent are below average in several subjects including Hebrew, English, and math.

Once on the ground, the Denver team was surprised to find 25 local volunteers waiting for them. Together, they made a HUGE

impact on the Lod community. Lod is known as the 'wrong side of the tracks." A rough city, there is a stigma attached to those who live there. The Denver Community Center in Lod and the Garin Hatorani school inspire these kids to get up and out of town and make a difference with their lives. Our fabulous young adults made special Chanukah packages for local families and with the local youth, went door to door delivering gelt and dreidels. The impact on this community, one of our sister communities, was immeasurable and we are excited to have more young adults go back!
