MICROBREWERIES TAP THIRST FOR LOCAL BEER

Tosa East Towne welcomed not one, but two new microbreweries in the past year and a half. Stock House Brewing Co. opened in November 2018, and The Fermentorium Barrel House opened in May 2019.

While they are virtually across the street from each other on West North Avenue, the businesses have taken a friendly and cooperative approach to becoming the neighborhood's first breweries. In July, the pair hosted the inaugural Brewery Games of East Tosa, which pitted teams against one another in trivia, scavenger tasks, photo hunts and other games to raise money for the Wisconsin chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society. The breweries also donated \$1 per pint that evening. They plan to team up again on future events.



SIGN UP NOW FOR RUN TOSA RUN

Spring is just around the corner, and that means it's time again to Run Tosa Run! This will be our seventh straight year putting on our neighborhood's annual 5K and kids' run, and the date has been set: Saturday, May 16.

BelAir Cantina and GRAEF have signed on again as lead sponsors of Run Tosa Run 2020, and online registration is now open. You can find the link at runtosarun.org.

The race has grown steadily over the past six years, and in 2019 our more than 300 registrants helped us raise enough money to donate \$5,500 to Ronald McDonald

House Charities Eastern Wisconsin. That's more than \$25,000 over six years.

It was an especially big year for our kids' run with dozens of young runners signing up to participate in this family favorite.

The cost to sign up for this year's 5K race is just \$25 through March 13, after which the price increases to \$30. The price after May 1 goes up to \$35. It's just \$8 for participants in our kids' run, which is about a




half-mile loop of one city block and geared for runners ages 10 and younger.


ROAD CLOSURES: Residents, please be aware that race day morning will require some street closures. Please plan accordingly. The block of 69th Street north of North Avenue will be fully closed until about 11 a.m., and other streets on the route will be partially closed during the 5K, which starts at 9 a.m. May 16, lasting up to an hour.

Established by Paul Hepp and Mark Mahoney, Stock House never brews the same beer twice. That works well with the nanobrewery's two-barrel brewing system, allowing for two to three house beers on tap at a time and a regular rotation to keep imbibers coming back for new brews, Hepp said. On a given day, Stock House may have anything from a brown ale to a Kolsch on its nine taps.

It also pays homage to the neighborhood with a large mural of the area on one wall, and has a mug club with numbered steins for regular customers. Stock House encourages patrons to order food from local restaurants and has a Pay It Forward board where guests can buy-ahead drinks for each other.

Hepp and Mahoney spent about a year bringing Stock House to fruition, Hepp said.

"Tosa, and specifically East Tosa, is an up-and-coming area, and that was the area we narrowed in on and wanted to be a part of," said Hepp, who found the location when he drove by and saw a "For Lease" sign in the window. "We fell in love with that spot. I don't know if we dropped a pin on a location if we could have found a better fit."

The Fermentorium Barrel House is an offshoot of the 20-barrel Cedarburg craft brewery founded by Kristopher Volkman in 2016. The Tosa tasting room is in full swing, with about 20 taps from The Fermentorium and a couple of guest brewers, from hefeweizen to stouts. A Grand Opening is planned for Feb. 28.

The Barrel House facility's strains of beer differ from those at the Cedarburg location, said Maggie Skinner, director of sales and marketing for The Fermentorium.

"We can set up a very small one- to three-barrel system and brew here just for sour and mixed fermentation projects," Skinner said. "Or we can transfer wort (from Cedarburg). This is just so that we can play with the science and play with the art form that I think beer making is."

As The Fermentorium's traffic increases, the differences between its two locations have become more apparent, and it has adjusted to accommodate, Skinner said.

"Cedarburg is just a different kind of town from Tosa," she said. "There are a lot of learning curves with that and





seeing what kind of beers people like."

What kind of beers do East Tosans like? Anything hoppy – particularly IPAs, she said.

Stock House and The Fermentorium have not only collaborated with each other, but also with Vennture Brew Co. at North 55th Street and West North Avenue in Uptown. Vennture opened in July 2018.

"We definitely try and collaborate," Skinner said. "Maybe not every single thing we do. We do need our own identity. And I think the vibe between Vennture and us and even Stock House are different, but they're still fairly chill. ... Great minds think alike."

Having several breweries will likely make W. North Ave. more of a draw for beer enthusiasts in other communities, bringing additional business for all three, Hepp said.

"There was kind of a thirst of not having any craft brewery scene there," he said. "We really want to make it that craft beer destination now, not just in our little neighborhood."
