
# Welcome, new TETNA Board


### Coordinator sought for Trick-or-Treat

#### Mapping history in Sanctuary Woods

What do you know about Wauwatosa's Sanctuary Woods?

These are 66+ acres of woods on the north side of Watertown Plank Road across from Froedtert Hospital. As the land itself remains something of a mystery to many in the community, a Wauwatosa resident was motivated to create an interactive map at tosahistory13.wixsite.com/tosa.

The map highlights dozens of fascinating locations in and near Sanctuary Woods by connecting a location with historic or contemporary photos, maps, and extended descriptions. The interactive map allows visitors to bridge a century of history with the infrastructure and natural beauty that remains.

It aims to answer such questions as: What are the



origins of a 6-foot tall sculptural dolphin urn sitting next to a meadow that used to be a lake? Or how was a crumbling cement porch used to look out over sunken gardens?

This is a detailed resource to discover or rediscover a cultural and natural treasure right in our own community. Ruins still exist today that date back to 1850. Check it out and seize the opportunity to be a tourist in our own town.

In the spring of 2019, there has also been a coordinated effort to remove invasive species buckthorn at Sanctuary Woods. Two events have already cleared a half acre restoring an old-growth oak savanna. The area and these efforts have been featured in several articles which can be found at awealthofnature.org (search "sanctuary woods").


#### Thanks to Beth Jaworski for sponsoring TETNA Rummage Sale


