

East Tosa Gran Prix always draws big crowds - and great cyclists - to the Tosa East Towne neighborhood.

The East Tosa Gran Prix, hosted by East Tosa Alliance, returns for its sixth year on Sunday, July 1.

The race, the final leg of the Tour of America's Dairyland (ToAD) presented by Kwik Trip, offers high-energy cycling action featuring pro and amateur racers from around the world.

The race is a neighborhood favorite and features a kids' race, local music, food, beverages and neighborhood parties. The route entails a loop of four Tosa East Towne blocks, on North Avenue, 69th Street, Meinecke Avenue and 65th Street.

Planning underway for lamppost signs

Tosa East Towne Neighborhood Association received 515 responses to its survey seeking residents' input on a design for new lamppost signs in our neighborhood. Each of our six finalists received dozens of first-place votes, but there was one clear leader, the colorful design submitted by Tosa East Towne native Zack Goehner.

Thanks to all who participated in our survey, and congratulations to Zack. The TETNA board at its February meeting approved his design for our lamppost signs.

Zack, 34, grew up on 64th and Meinecke, and after leaving town to

live in Seattle for about 10 years he moved back to the neighborhood last year "so my kids could be closer to their grandparents."

"I have been inspired creatively by our neighborhood since childhood," Zack told TETNA. "I had countless sketches of our house and crayon-drawn maps of our streets. So I'm forever grateful to have had an opportunity to contribute to our neighborhood through art."

Here's how he describes the idea for his winning sign design:


"The design was inspired by the majestic rows of

bungalows that stand throughout our neighborhood — Tosa East Towne's signature aesthetic and symbols of our closeness as neighbors. I tried to capture the enchanting colors and shapes that appear when the first and last light of the day hits our streets. The signs will



be a warm welcome: unique and colorful, just like we are."

We also want to thank Zack for turning his sign design



into a cool new logo for our annual Run Tosa Run. All our runners received T-shirts featuring the logo. You can find more works in his portfolio at *braveappliance.com*.

TETNA is currently working with city officials to approve our design so we can order the signs and schedule installation. Because of a backlog of work on the city's schedule and deliberations this year by the Board of Public Works about city policies, the signs are not likely to be installed this spring or summer, as we had hoped.



Finally, we appreciate everyone who came out for our annual meeting April 18 during a fluke late-season snowstorm.




