


The carjackings "provided a good example of how the block watch captains could be used to transmit vital information to neighbors," Tosa East Towne safety liaison Tim Sumiec said. "We have to get creative to reach as many people as possible, not only for troubling events but for fun community events as well."

The main requirement of the block watch captain is to deliver the "Tosa Watch" newsletter on a quarterly basis. If you are interested in gathering your neighbors and hosting an introductory block watch meeting, community policing officers from the Wauwatosa Police Department would come and speak; further explaining the program and police expectations.

# Pick up a copy of 'Lab Girl'

Tosa's All-City Read, for those unfamiliar with the event, invites city residents to join in reading a book together and then gathering in February for discussion groups and other activities held throughout the city. This is the fifth year for the program, sponsored by the Wauwatosa Neighborhood Association Council, of which TETNA is a member.

This year's selection is "Lab Girl," by Hope Jahren. The book is a beautifully written account of Jahren's life as a scientist. intertwined with relevant observations and information about the lives of the plants that she studies. Often, she cites plant behavior to reflect or expand on her own evolution as a woman and a scientist, or to reinforce what experience has taught her about life or human nature. She does this deftly and with a light touch, so that it never feels forced or obvious.

Hers is a complex story that has taken her from her childhood in Minnesota, to studies and jobs and fellowships all over the world. Along the way, she had to learn to live with bipolar disorder. While working on her PhD at Berkley, one of Jahren's responsibilities was to take students on field trips to study soil by digging holes and "stooping over them for hours." On one field trip, she observed a student who seemed to have an unusual fascination with holes. His name was Bill and he advised her the he liked to dig because he had once lived in hole.

So began one of the more remarkable and engaging aspects of her story, which is her lifelong friendship with Bill. She and Bill became inseparable partners in science, if not romance, and moved together from one lab to another even when Jahren's meager grants did not include money for Bill. He slept in one lab that he helped her build and lived in a car in a parking lot outside another, until she reached the stature as a scientist that allowed her to pay Bill enough that he could buy a house, a few doors down from the one she shared with her new husband.

The official name for Jahren's speciality is geobiology. This is the



study of the relationship between the biosphere and the geosphere. She has won a number of awards in her field including three Fulbright Fellowships, the Donath Medal awarded by the Geological Society of America, and the Macelwane Medal from the American Geophysical Union. In 2016, she was listed as one of Time Magazine's 100 Most Influential People. She is presently living in Oslo with her husband and son, teaching and conducting research through the University of Oslo's Centre for Earth Evolution and Dynamics. Bill Hagopian is her lab manager.

"Lab Girl" is adult non-fiction but suitable for most readers of high school age and above. There are copies of the book available through the Wauwatosa Public Library and through area and online booksellers. emphasize, as well as events that may no longer be worth bringing back. And we've been discussing ideas for new events to offer to the neighborhood.

The annual Egg Hunt, for example, has grown steadily in recent years. Our Block Party/Movie Night, on the other hand, has seen turnout diminish. We've decided to end that event while supporting other great events being held at the park.

We don't want to reduce our lineup without trying to replace old events with new ideas that have potential to become annual favorites. That's where you come in.

The TETNA board approved up to \$500 in this year's budget as seed money to create a new event. We have received several suggestions and now are looking for residents willing to help organize one or more of the new events, such as: **Winterfest, an East Tosa pub crawl, roller skating night, movie night (at Rosebud), outdoor sports game screenings and a kickball tournament**.

If you would like to volunteer, or suggest a different idea, email us at *info@tosaeasttowne.org*. Events preferably have a revenue stream to help offset the cost, but we still may pursue certain worthy events without revenue streams if TETNA deems them beneficial to our members.

# Construction underway on pocket park

#### **RUN TOSA RUN DONATION**




