## It's Time to Prepare Your Garden

It may seem strange, but now is the time to start planning your garden. In the winter months, I pull out the seed catalog (Johnnie's Seeds is one of my favorites), grab my pen and start circling vegetables and flowers and dog-earring the pages.

A few mainstays of my vegetable garden are spinach, oak leaf lettuces, pole beans, tomatoes, peppers, zucchini, jalapeno for my husband, and different favorite herbs like basil, chives, and cilantro.

Some herbs and pest-retardant flowers come back. I have had my chives for three years in the same spot. Nasturtiums, a natural deterrent for the squash beetle and other pests, re-seed them selves and are good to plant next to your zucchini or acorn squash. Marigolds are prolific and repel pesky bugs too. But of course all of these things attract the wonderful pollinating bees that benefit our gardens so much!

I had a little fun last year, planting corn. It reminds me of having grown up as a Hoosier girl playing in the corn fields around my house in the country. We did actually get some ears last summer, but mostly, I just wanted to be able to touch and smell the leaves!

When you grow your own vegetables, they may not look like what you are used to seeing in the store. I grew cauliflower last summer and we were turned off by the look of the florets that formed. Later, on a Permaculture YouTube video, we saw that this is normal and what really good-tasting produce looks like. Remember the stuff in the store is valued by its shelf-life, not its flavor.

This is the time of year I also start planting my seedlings indoors. Marigolds, onion sets, kohlrabi, tomatoes, cucumbers and pepper plants, can be started in seed cups then transplanted to the garden when the warmer weather arrives. Pick a sunny spot and keep them moist with a cover until they have sprouted.

Since the winter solstice has passed and days are getting longer, we have started planting micro-greens which can be harvested, eaten and replanted every ten days.

Whatever you decide to try this year, remember that gardening is a constant experiment of trial and er-

ror. Plant more than you think you need, and if it doesn't thrive in that spot, try a new spot or just pull it out and plant something else!

But the true joy of gardening is watching it grow. That and picking a few items and making your own dish of salsa to go with your family's dinner!

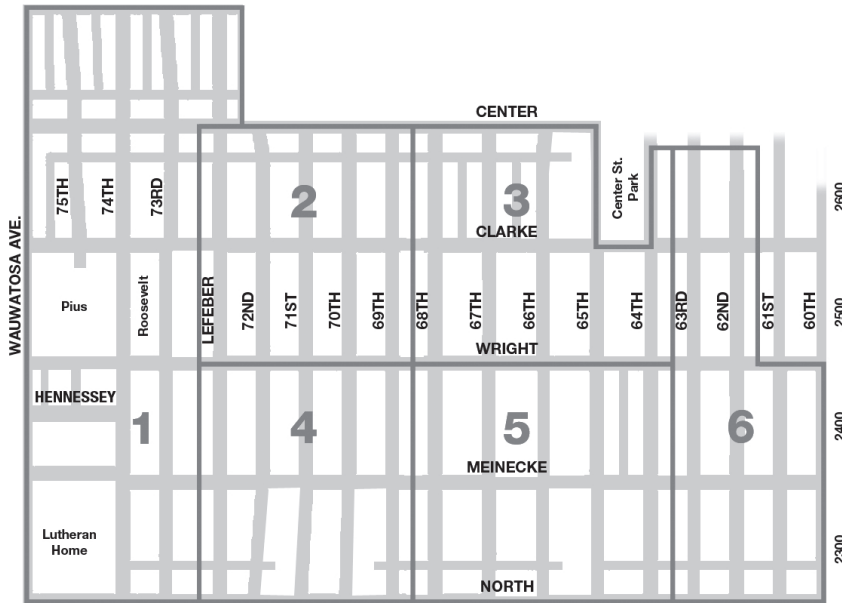
