

### Volunteer to Build Your Neighborhood "Ark"

I know, I know. You hear all the time about the need for volunteers. "We need help here!" "We need help there!" I know. I get it.

BUT...

If you give a little of your time, each of you, do you know how much that would add up to? 2300 households, each giving 20 minutes of time equals 776 man hours! (And any of you who really know me, my ears are smoking from calculating that sum!)



Relay For Life is the American Cancer Society signature fundraising event that gives participants a chance to celebrate cancer survivors, remember loved ones lost, and fight back against the disease. Relay is a fun-filled overnight event where teams of 8-15 people camp out at a local track and take turns walking around the track. Each team has a representative on the track at all times during the event. Because cancer never sleeps, neither do Relay participants for this one evening.

Relay starts with an Opening Ceremony in which we honor cancer survivors. Survivors join together for the first lap while



everyone encourages them and celebrates all they've overcome. Around dusk we have our Luminaria Ceremony in which we honor and remember all of those who have been affected by cancer. Luminaria are white paper bags that are decorated and placed around the track. During our ceremony, the bags are lit and the night is brightened by the glow of a name of someone who has battled cancer.

Participants can also join in our other activities: spoofs of reality TV shows, Wii tournaments, music, talent shows, hypnotists, Olympics, themed laps, karaoke, bean bags, dunk tanks, etc. There is something for everyone at Relay For Life!


