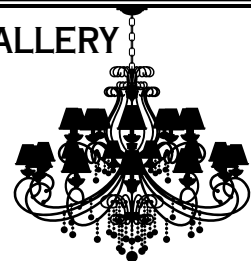

Memory Corner

From Amy Hugo, former Wauwatosa East Towne resident, now living in Minnesota

My mother enjoyed going to Hoyt Swimming Pool occasionally during the '50s and '60s, and I during the '70s. The pool rules were strict at that time. Girls (or anyone with long hair) had to wear swimming caps. Showers before entering the pool were mandatory. No items could be brought into the pool or pool area—not even a towel. Nose plugs were allowed. A steel safety pin with an engraved number was pinned to the swimsuit. The pin was given when you checked your shoes and clothes. Everyone had to line up for a foot inspection (for athlete's foot) before entering the pool.

At the discretion of the lifeguard, a swimming test consisting of one to two laps was given for swimmers in the deep area. If you passed, you could remain in the six foot deep area.

It was fun to watch the people dive, especially from the high diving board. The changing of the guards was impressive, and trains going by with their loud whistles were unforgettable. Most of all, the price was right—only 50 cents!!!

There was a large concession stand, so afterwards swimmers could enjoy an ice cream bar, soda, popcorn, or a hot dog. We always had fun afterwards walking along the Menomonee River and maybe having a picnic lunch we brought from home.

All the out-of-towners were awed by the size of Hoyt Pool—largest in the state and nation.

Memory from Amy Fox:

I have lived in Wauwatosa almost my whole life. I grew up on Lefebber Avenue. I have a lot of wonderful memories growing up and living here, but the memory I would like to share with you is one of my favorites. I don't know when it started or when it ended. All I can tell you is that I was a kid and it was magical. The memory I am talking about was North Avenue Days.

It was a time when the busiest street was closed off (from 68th? to 71st?) and the carnival came to town. We would go at dusk. Just after supper, my friend, Tricia, and I would wander through all the

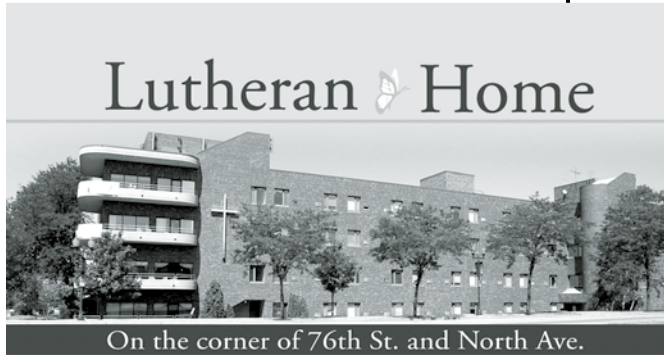

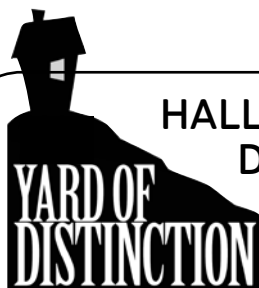

booths lit by what seemed to be millions of tiny white lights. Lastly we would ride the tilt-a-whirl till it was time to go home. It was the 70's and songs like "It's magic" by the band, Pilot, and "Dance with me" by the Orleans would be echoing down the streets and in our heads.

I can remember this event like it was yesterday, walking home so tired from laughing, clutching our gold fish in one hand and the wonderful glass Coke bottle trophy in the other. It was magic.

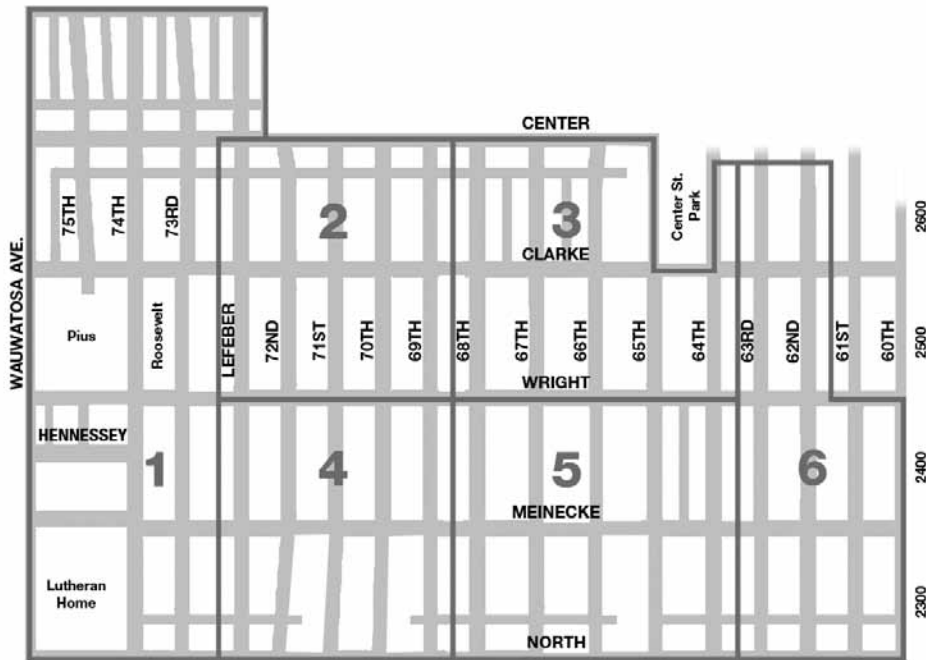
