President's Letter HELLO, TOSA EAST TOWNE RESIDENTS!

nother summer done and I can't believe it is over. Too fast. But what wonderful things were accomplished. My girls passed another swimming level with the Rec Dept. Our dog learned that she can swim. I went blonde. My husband shaved his head. And I realized I have a middle-schooler —and all that that implies! (Eye roll.)

But some other things happened that were truly magnificent. My husband works at First Stage Children's Theater and they have a Theater Academy where kids learn "Life Skills Through Stage Skills." It is an amazing place, but the kids are what make it great. There are scholarships for students who really want to come but can't afford it. And the students came up with a way to give back. Pay it forward, if you will. They started a fund called the Kid-To-Kid Campaign. The students bring their spare change, and instead of buying a soda at lunch, they drop it in the bucket. All that change adds up. If on one given day, say, last Wednesday, they raised \$700-to break the last record of \$635-my husband said he would shave his head. One student did the math and realized that if each of them brought in \$3.50 they would break that record and make the goal. \$3.50 isn't much. But multiplied by 200?

This year, on that given day, when I went in to shave my husband's head—because we just knew that they would make it—I was astounded at the generosity, enthusiasm, and genuine emotion in the room when the announcement was made for the total. All I heard was, "One thousand..." and then it was cut off by the explosion of cheering, yelling, stomping, and celebrating of the students. Their excitement was bolstered by the thought that others would be able to come and enjoy what they were enjoying. That they were helping others.

One person doing an act of kindness is good. But, a bunch of people performing acts of kindness are a force to be reckoned with!

Look at what they did. Just a bunch of kids. Just a handful of change at a time.

Tosa East Towne did a little of that this summer too. We made a difference and you may have been a part of it. We held our very first Charity Run this year. We wanted to give to Ronald McDonald House Charities because of the good work they do for families with kids at Children's Hospital. Our goal for this first time was to get 50 participants. We got 61! Our goal was to raise \$500 to donate. We raised over \$850!

So thank you to all who volunteered, who registered, who handed out water, who planned, who set up barricades, who brought bagels, who cheered, who gave mini-massages, who called the stopwatch, who kept their vehicles in their driveways until it was over. Thank you, thank you!

And in the words of my great friend, First Stage Theater Academy director, John Maclay, "One person doing an act of kindness is good. But, a bunch of people performing acts of kindness are a force to be reckoned with!"
