

### East Townies Know a Good Deal



### Meet Your Neighbor: Meg Miller

### NORTH AVENUE NEIGHBORHOOD ALLIANCE FOUNDER

"Wau, wau, wau, What?"

That was Meg Miller's response when she first heard about Wauwatosa more than ten years ago.

eg and her husband had moved from Colorado to the east side of Milwaukee and were looking for a home. "When people asked us what we were looking for, we'd say a good, solid community; a place you could walk to dinner, movies and school. People told us you should look in Wauwatosa."

It may not have rolled off the tongue at first, but now talking up Wauwatosa is one of Meg's passions. She is the founder of the North Avenue Neighborhood Alliance—a non-profit, grass roots group that encourages and advocates for the economic sustainability of North Avenue.

"We started out as a group of people meeting to talk about the Pay Day loan store that wanted to open up on North Avenue." Meg says they went from asking the question, "Why would that kind of business want to move here?" to "What kind of businesses do we want moving in?"

Meg says all 16 people at the meeting had their own ideas for what they'd like to see on North Avenue, but they decided to issue a survey of the area residents. More than 350 people responded, and since then, the Alliance has

used that survey to help in initiatives such as putting up pedestrian yield signs in the crosswalks and actively seeking new businesses.

Meg says her group acts as a bridge between the businesses on North Avenue and the residents. "It's a symbiotic relationship. Our neighborhood businesses can't stand on their own, and our residents can't stand alone without a vibrant North Avenue."

Right now the North Avenue Neighborhood Alliance is made up of volunteers, representing North Avenue businesses and the five surrounding neighborhood associations, including East Towne. Meg hopes they can eventually secure funding for a paid employee to run the alliance.

The Alliance was awarded a \$40,000 block grant to fund the development of a long-term plan for the future economic sustainability of North Avenue. This past May, a consultant took suggestions from residents and the city's planning task force and has begun drafting plans.

Besides running the Alliance, Meg started her own marketing company a couple of years ago promoting healthy, active lifestyles for children. Meg and her husband, Scott, have a son and a daughter at Roosevelt Elementary. When Meg isn't working, or volunteering or managing her busy family, she says she loves to read, especially historical fiction and to garden. "We have a community garden for veggies, and I spend time tending to my flower garden at home. I love to walk with my Golden through our beautiful neighborhoods."

She says they like Tosa so much that when it came time to find a bigger house, they moved just two blocks east. The reasons were clear for staying in Tosa. "It attracts people from many different places with different personalities. The charm, the walkability, the easy access to all the great things you want in a community."

And Meg is committed to promoting more great things for our community.

## Create a Healthy and Safe Lawn this Summer

Summer is here, and for most of us it means taking care or our lawns. Large or small, it is the time of the year to learn how to keep our lawns healthy and getting others to do the same without toxic and harmful pesticides.

The world is rapidly changing, and with it, our perspectives on the use of toxic lawn chemicals and the hazards they pose to our children, families, neighbors, wildlife, and drinking water sources.

Maintaining a healthy lawn involves many things which take time and patience. For some people, along with other landscaping, this task is essential for creating good curb appeal. We may also choose to keep our lawns looking nice and weed free for our neighbors, and residents of the community. We try and avoid the spread of weed seeds across property lines, and hope our neighbors do the same. Simply put, the presence of weeds is a sign of a lawn undergoing stress. Not a sign to spray poisonous chemicals.

You might try what some East Towne residents are currently doing to maintain a healthy lawn.

- 1. Get a soil test to know what you are working with and talk to a landscape professional
- 2. Remove weeds in the spring when plant root reserves are low.
- 3. Feed the soil and not the plant. Try an organic conditioner, such as compost to nourish the soil.
- 4. Eliminate pesticides on your lawn or garden, especially if you have children or pets. If you choose to fertilize, purchase an organic fertilizer like Milorganite rather than any synthetic type.



- 5. Mow high, three inches to a minimum, to shade the ground and provide better habitat.
- 6. Aerate your lawn. Many weeds thrive in compacted, poorly draining soil
- 7. Over seed your lawn in the fall.

Visit the Greater Madison Healthy Lawn Team (www.healthylawnteam.org), or the Healthy Communities Project (www.healthycommunitiesproject.org), local groups of the National Coalition for Pesticide-Free Lawns (www.pesticidefreelawns.org) which have many links to help you go pesticide free.






