
Paid members in the neighborhood association have the opportunity to vote either by email or paper ballot. Ballots may be submitted at the General Membership Meeting on May 2nd.

ABC Streets Neighborhood Association Participates in City Living Sundays!

The ABC Streets participated, for the second year, in the City Living Sundays program on March 24th. Nancy Sears, Susan Glenz, Tom Pastecki and Brian Sears manned our table. Although there weren't any homes for sale in our neighborhood, it didn't discourage enthusiasm from the visitors who stopped at our table to talk about our neighborhood. Our display this year featured a number of quotes from neighbors about Why I Like Living in the ABC Streets Neighborhood. We are pleased to report that our efforts to enhance our neighborhood gateway at Culver and Harvard was highly-praised by many attendees. including Mayor Tom Richards.



PAC-TAC comes to the ABC Streets!

In early 2013, twelve of your neighbors committed to volunteering a minimum of two hours per month to "walk the streets" to provide a PAC-TAC presence in our neighborhood. All of these volunteers have attended the required training course by Officer Michele Velez of the RPD and have walked the neighborhood accompanied by Officer Velez and Officer Brian Bannerman, gaining knowledge and hands-on training in the use of police radios to report any trouble or incidents. PAC-TAC visibility in other neighborhoods has proven to put the word out to criminal elements that they are under watch.

There is no set schedule. Walks are held Monday through Friday, between 8:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m., dependent upon volunteer schedules. Volunteers need only to commit for two hours a month.


To Our Neighborhood Renters & Tenants

CHILI CHAMPS WINNING RECIPE!











1 lb. ground beef
2 garlic cloves, chopped
½-cup red wine
2-3 tbsp. chili powder
1 can diced tomatoes
1 can tomato paste
Salt & pepper, to taste

½-lb. sausage (*cαsing removed*)

1 tbsp. olive oil 1/4-cup sherry

1 red pepper, chopped

1 can drained pineapple tidbits

1 can black beans

- In frying pan, season oil with garlic over medium heat. Brown beef and sausage.
- 2. Deglaze pan with sherry.
- 3. Add red pepper and cook until it begins to soften.
- 4. Add red wine and black pepper and allow wine to simmer off slightly.
- Place meat mixture in a slow cooker, add chili powder, tomatoes, tomato paste and pineapple.
- 6. Cook on low heat for 4-6 hours.
- 7. Add beans for final 30-60 minutes to heat through.


