The ABC Streets Neighborhood Association participated, for the first time, in the City Living Sundays program on April 18, 2010 at East High. Nancy Sears, Brian Sears and Tom Pastecki manned the table.

City Living Sundays is a City of Rochester event that provides an opportunity for would-be homeowners to learn more about the benefits and perks of buying a home in the City. Participants included area lenders, neighborhood associations, private businesses, the Greater Rochester Association of Realtors, The Landmark Society of Western New York and Rochester City School District. 


Join/Renew Your Membership in the ABC Streets Neighborhood Association
